The recent assassination of Charlie Kirk is the latest reminder of how badly our country needs prayer and a fresh touch from God. We especially cry out for God's touch on Mr. Kirk's widow and little children who have been left behind due to this evil act. What a heartbreaking tragedy it is when there are extremists in our country who seek to settle our political differences with lethal violence. And this evil violence comes from both sides of the political aisle. This past June, it was a former Speaker of the House in Minnesota, Melissa Hortman, and her husband Mark who were shot to death in their own home because of their political orientation. That family needs our prayers as well; two adult children of the Hortmans were orphaned by that tragedy. And the examples go on and on. We all remember the two near miss attempts on President Trump's life. It's lunacy that reminds us of a dark era like the 1960's.

Let's be clear: using violence to deal with our political differences is never right. Full stop. It doesn't matter which side of the political divide we're talking about; violence is never in order. Pray for our country. Pray that God will draw us back to Himself. We are desperate for His help. And pray that our church and all Biblebelieving churches will declare truth and seek to live by it. May we be found faithful particularly in sharing the hope of Christ in the gospel. May God again bless the United States of America.
